

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
ON PETITION TO VACATE PORTION OF PLATTED PUBLIC ROAD
(Ala. Code § 23-4-20)**

August 31, 2026

RE: Notice of Public Hearing on Petition to Vacate a Portion of Platted Road/Right-of-Way, L.P. Tunstill Estate Elk River Subdivision (Plat Book D, Page 62), Limestone County, Alabama

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that, pursuant to Ala. Code § 23-4-20, a petition has been filed with the Limestone County Commission (the "Commission") by Slater Wade Robinson ("Petitioner"), owner of Lots 15, 16, 17, and 18 of the L.P. Tunstill Estate Elk River Subdivision, as shown on the plat of said subdivision recorded in Plat Book D, Page 62, in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Limestone County, Alabama, requesting that the Commission vacate a portion of a platted road/right-of-way that traverses Petitioner's said lots (the "Road").

Description of the Road. The Road, as platted, has never been constructed, opened, improved, or maintained by Limestone County or by the original developer of the subdivision, and remains an unopened, unimproved right-of-way. The specific portion of the Road proposed to be vacated is depicted on the recorded plat referenced above and on the exhibit accompanying Petitioner's petition, which is on file with, and available for inspection at, the office of the Limestone County Administrator, 100 South Clinton Street, Athens, Alabama, during regular business hours.

Reason for This Notice. This notice is posted to satisfy the requirement found in Ala. Code § 23-4-20(a) to post notice of public hearings concerning petitions to vacate public roads.

Public Hearing. The Commission will hold a public hearing on the Petition as part of its regular meeting, as follows:

Date: Monday, October 5, 2026
Time: During the regular meeting of the Limestone County Commission immediately following the Commission's work session, which convenes at 9:00 a.m.
Place: Clinton Street Courthouse Annex, 100 South Clinton Street, Athens, Alabama

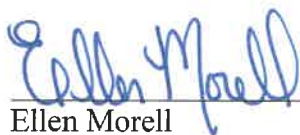
At the hearing, any interested person may appear and be heard, and may submit written comments or objections concerning the proposed vacation, either in advance of the hearing or at the hearing itself.

Effect of Vacation. If the Commission grants the Petition, the vacation will have the effect provided in Ala. Code § 23-4-2(b), including that the vacation shall not deprive other property owners of any right they may have to convenient and reasonable means of ingress and egress to and from their property, and that if such right is not afforded by the remaining streets and alleys, another street or alley affording that right must be dedicated. Any entity with utility lines,

equipment, or facilities in place within or crossing the Road at the time of vacation shall retain the rights described in Ala. Code § 23-4-20(f), including the right to continue to access, maintain, extend, and enlarge such lines, equipment, and facilities to the same extent as if the vacation had not occurred. Any appeal of the Commission's decision shall be taken as provided in Ala. Code § 23-4-5.
